

HARVARD UNIVERSITY PROGRAM FOR SENIOR EXECUTIVES IN NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL SECURITY

This two-week program is offered in late summer at the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University in Cambridge, Massachusetts. The program provides senior officials with the opportunity to consider issues of national security with a broad spectrum of peers, and enhances their ability to work effectively and constructively with people whose orientations may differ from their own.

Who Should Attend

The program is designed for flag and general rank officers from the armed services and civilians of comparable levels from Defense, State, Office of Management & Budget and other organizations concerned with foreign affairs and national security, including the intelligence community, committees of Congress and the private sector. Typically, participants are executives who make or influence strategic decisions within their organizations or are called upon to implement major policies.

Program Highlights

- Emphasizes the importance of how one thinks not simply what one knows; and
- Designed to help people whose personal decisions and/or recommendations can critically affect the political, economic or military interests of the United States.
