SDM is a program, to educate future technical leaders in architecting, engineering, and designing complex products and systems. The program provides both engineering depth and management breadth. Jointly sponsored by the MIT School of Engineering and the Sloan School of Management, the SDM program is offered as a thirteen-month resident program. Over 30 companies and organizations have sponsored students – this great diversity in student knowledge and experience leads to a very rich learning environment.

Who Should Attend

The “average” SDM student is 36 years old, with 10+ years of work experience. Participants should: either hold an MS in engineering and have 3 or more years experience in a technical field, including some leadership experience; or hold a BS in engineering or a hard science and have 5 or more years of engineering experience; have experience contributing to a product or system development project; have responsibility as a group or team leader; have a recent score on the Graduate Record Exam (GRE) or Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT).

Program Highlights

- Focus on complex products and systems providing individuals with both management skills and deeper technical understanding.
- January program start – builds cohort, initial coursework and Design Challenges
- Two-year distance learning option (part time) allows students to continue working part-time while applying “learnings” to the job.
- 10-14 day International Business Trip
- Strong alumni network and lifelong learning community offers opportunity to attend live web-based seminars, alumni learning events and distance courses.
